Update NZIDE Constitution – Rule 13(a)(iii) President of the Auckland District Law

Re: Society – Replace with any type of consensual dispute resolution (for example,

mediation, facilitation, or a tikanga-based practice)

The NZIDE Constitution rule 13(a)(iii) says

The appeal board shall consist of three persons, one being nominated by the Executive and being himself/herself an Executive member, one being nominated by the appellant (such nominee being not necessarily a member of the Institute) and one being the President of the Auckland District Law Society or his/her nominee. The decision of the appeal board shall be final. The appeal board shall have jurisdiction to make an order as to payment of the costs of the appeal.

Specific reference to the President of the Auckland District Law Society or his/her nominee restricts choice of the third appeal board member.

The Incorporated Societies Act 2022 Schedule 2 section 7(2)¹ says a society may, with the consent of all parties to a complaint, refer the complaint to any type of consensual dispute resolution (for example, mediation, facilitation, or a tikanga-based practice).

On 25 August 2022 the NZIDE Executive Committee resolved the motion below. The motion is now put to the AGM.

Motion: that the NZIDE Constitution rule 13(a)(iii) be changed to read

The appeal board shall consist of three persons, one being nominated by the Executive and being himself/herself an Executive member, one being nominated by the appellant (such nominee being not necessarily a member of the Institute) and one being a consensual dispute resolution provider (for example, mediation, facilitation, or a tikanga-based practice). The decision of the appeal board shall be final. The appeal board shall have jurisdiction to make an order as to payment of the costs of the appeal.
